

TIDBITS FROM THE TREASURER

Thanks to everyone for your attention to the Financial information at the January meeting. Feedback to the executive suggests the membership seems to feel this amount of detail meets our needs.

At the February meeting, a provisional budget, as approved by the executive will be presented for a membership vote. Subsequent to the meeting there are two items that have been adjusted:


- 1) The advertising revenue will be more accurately budgeted as \$850 (instead of \$1200)
- 2) Upon request of a member(s), we have added a Sponsorship item of \$450 in the 2008 year for the North Vancouver City, North Vancouver District, and West Vancouver

Libraries. This would be to provide funds specifically toward

updated quilting books for public circulation. This has been something which the Guild has supported in former years.

This means that the projected budget has approximately a \$900 shortfall for the current year.

The executive feels that the Library Sponsorship, High School Scholarship, and items such as the of Album of Quilts Social event Sponsorship are discretionary items that can be reviewed yearly, taking into account the financial performance of the Guild during the previous year(s). Bearing in mind that we are a non-profit organization, and we retain about a years operations funds in reserve, the current executive feels that a small deficit budget is a reasonable proposition.

Many thanks to all of you who continue to offer your assistance and support for the show. Admission ticket packages will be available at the membership table at the February and March meetings.

For those members who were not in attendance at the last meeting, some changes to the show were announced.

- 1. Hours of operation will be Fri./Sat. 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., Sun. 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. All quilts will be picked up by 6 p.m. on Sunday. Attendance is very slow late Sunday afternoon. This change will save on facility rental charges and overtime custodial fees. It also allows members to be home on Sunday evening.
- 2. There will not be a catalogue. This is a luxury we can no longer afford and will provide savings of \$2500. Descriptions will still be hung on the quilts.
- 3. After considerable discussion with the committee and listening to input from the executive and individual guild members, a decision has been made to continue the tradition of the guild social on the Saturday evening of the show. The social is viewed as a very positive guild event and allows us to view the quilts in a leisurely manner. (i.e. with a glass of wine in hand).

MELTDOWN & BURNOUT, with Eileen Neill

Eileen had been experimenting with non-traditional materials for the past 3 years. In this 2 day workshop we will explore materials such as tyvek, polyester sheers, plastic wrapping paper, and puff paints to make interesting surfaces, which can then be applied to fabric to make small wall hangings. In working with these materials Eileen has tried melting them using various heating appliances with interesting results. The first day we will mainly experiment with the materials and techniques. On the second day we will use the exciting samples that we have made to make a small wall hanging.
